Notice of Race

June 12 & 13 , 2021

1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Sail Canada Prescriptions 2021 - 2024.
- 1.2 Changes have been made by these Sailing Instructions to the following RRS sections: 29.1 (Individual Recall), 32.2 (Shorting of Course after the Start), 35 (Time Limit and Scores), 61.1, (Protest Requirements).

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 The Regatta is open to all sailors who hold a valid membership in the *Sunshine Bay or Edmonton Yacht clubs*.

3. Fees

- 3.1 \$30.00 per boat
- 3.2 **FREE** when Inventory Declaration form is submitted (See attached)
- 3.3 All fees are payable by cash , cheque or EFT to Edmonton Yacht Club. Sorry no credit or debit payments accepted.

4. Wabamum PHRF

- 4.1 New this year, the Wabamum PHRF is intended to make the Races as Fair / Fun as possible by establishing a personalized PHRF for each Boat.
- 4.2 to get your individual PHRF rating, fill in and submit the 2021 Yacht Registration and Equipment Inventory Declaration to your Fleet Captain.
- 4.3 The Form is just 1 page and your Fleet Captain and others will be available after the first day of racing if you need assistance filling in the form.
- 4.4 Your Fleet Captain will establish your PHRF rating by using the Low Handicap from the US PHRF and adjust per the PHRF Wabamum HAndicap Adjustments (see <https://www.sunshinebay.org/racing>)

5. Schedule

- 5.1 Registration Form to be submitted Prior to 9:25am on June 12th. (See attached)
 - email fleetcaptain@edmontonyachtclub.ca
 - Or - drop off at EYC Clubhouse
- 5.2 Skippers Meeting : 9:30am at EYC Clubhouse June 12th - optional due to COVID (will be held outside clubhouse - weather permitting - please bring mask).
- 5.3 Sailing Instructions for Spring Series 2021 (see attached).
- 5.4 Start of first race each day: 11:00am.
- 5.5 **Number of races:** Up to 3 races a day / 6 races total scheduled for this two day Series.
- 5.6 Winners and overall standings will be Announced via email, Newsletter and Web page

6. Course

- 6.1 The course is a Sausage (course # 1) with all marks to port. Start - 1- 2 - 1 - 2 - Finish (see attached course layouts.
- 6.2 The approximate course length is 5 nautical miles (depending on wind conditions day of race).

7. Fleets

7.1 All boats will race as one fleet.

8. Scoring

8.1 One race constitutes a series

8.2 When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

8.3 When 5 – 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

8.4 When 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

9. Radio Communications

9.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats.

9.2 The Race Officer may communicate with the race fleet on channel 72.

10. Disclaimer of Liability

10.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk.

See RRS 4, Decision to Race. 10.2 The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

11. Insurance

11.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000.00 per incident or the equivalent.

12. Rights to Use Name and Likeness

12.1 In participating in this event, a competitor automatically grants the *Organizing Authority* and the sponsors the right in perpetuity, to make, use or show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

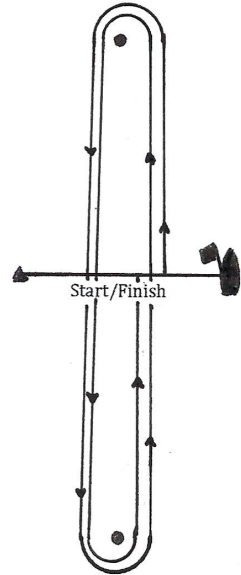

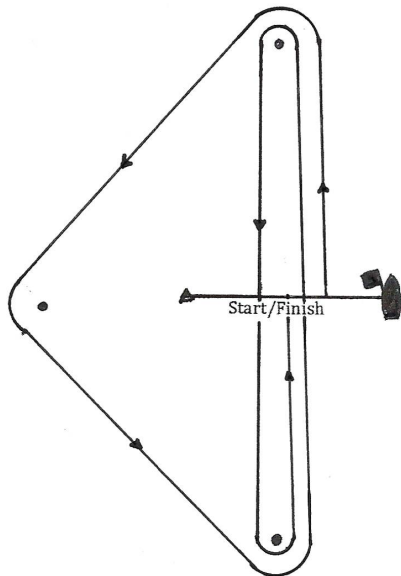

Edmonton Yacht Club Sailing Instructions

SPRING SERIES June
12 & 13 , 2021



1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Sail Canada Prescriptions 2021 - 2024.
- 1.2 Changes have been made by these Sailing Instructions to the following RRS sections: 29.1 (Individual Recall), 32.2 (Shorting of Course after the Start), 35 (Time Limit and Scores), 61.1, (Protest Requirements).

2. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 2.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
- 2.2 Competitors are encouraged to monitor their VHF radio for warnings and communication from the Race Committee.

3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official SBYC and EYC notice board.
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 72.

4. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09:00 on the day it will take effect.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 The starting horn for the first race each day of the regatta will be at 11:00 sharp.
- 5.2 The following race, each day, will start 15 minutes after the last boat has crossed the finish line in the previous race.
- 5.3 A minimum of two (2) races is scheduled for each race day.
- 5.4 No race will be started after 3pm on Saturday and 2pm on Sunday.

6. CLASS FLAGS

- 6.1 Red Fleet #1 Pennant

7. Marks

- 7.1 All marks are to be left to your port side.

8. THE COURSE

- 8.1 The approximate anticipated location of the marks and the course layout to be used will be relayed at the skippers meeting.
- 8.2 Course # 1 is a Windward-Leeward Course. Start - 1 - 2 - 1 - 2 - Finish, with an approximate course length of five (5) nautical miles. See attached diagram.
- 8.4 This is an "Open Line" courses. Races are allowed to cross the start/finish line during the race.

9. THE START and START SEQUENCE

- 9.1 The starting order for each class will be as follows:
Red Fleet- warning signal 10:55 each race day

- 9.3 The race committee may, no later than the warning signal, trail a mark or a whaler from the stern of the race committee boat stationed at the starboard end of the starting line. The mark or whaler will be considered to be an extension of the race committee boat. No boat may pass between the trailing mark and the race committee boat.
- 9.4 Start Sequence - Races will be started with RRS 26
- 5 minutes before the start Pennant # 1 is raised with one horn.
 - 4 minutes before the start the Preparatory signal is raised with one horn
 - 1 minute before the start the Preparatory signal is lowered with on long horn
 - Start signal is announced by the lowering of the # 1 pennant and one horn.

10. RECALLS

- 10.1 When individual recalls are signaled, the race committee may (at its discretion) attempt to hail the sail number or boat names of the recalled boat(s) by VHF radio on channel 72. Failure of the race committee to hail or failure of a boat to hear the hail of its sail number or name shall not relieve the boat of its obligation to start correctly. This changes RRS 29.1 and 62.1(a).

11. SHORTING OF COURSE AFTER THE START

- 11.1 A shortened course may be implemented when no boat has been able to round the first mark within 30 minutes of the start of the first fleet.
- 11.2 If the race committee determines that no boat will be able to complete the whole course within the time limit of two (2) hours, they may shorten the course.
- 11.3 When shorting the course, a race committee boat (whaler) will be stationed within a leg of the course. The display of Code Flag "S" with two repetitive sound signals means: "finish between the finish line committee boat and the finish line mark. This changes RRS 32.2

12. THE FINISH

- 12.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a Yellow flag on the start/finish line committee boat and the nearby mark.

13. TIME LIMITS

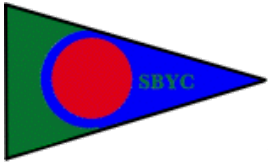
- 13.1 A boat that finishes more than 30- minutes after the first finisher in it fleet shall be scored as DNF. This changes RRS 35.

14. SCORING

- 14.1 Handicaps applied will be in accordance with PHRF Wabamum (US PHRF with Wabamum Adjustments).
- 14.2 Ties will be broken in favor of the boat with lowest sum of corrected time for all races.

15. Protests

- 15.1 A boat intending to protest shall notify the race committee boat of its intent to protest and notify the protested boat at time of incident to allow protested boat to have the opportunity to do penalty turn(s). This changes RRS 61.1(a))
- 15.2 Protests will be written and delivered to the Protest Committee Chairperson before the end of "Protest Filing Time," which will begin when the committee boat docks and end 45 minutes later.
- 15.3 Protests will be heard as soon as possible, in approximately the order of receipt.
